She stuck with the modeling and soon became one of the DMV's original vixens.

When Ree was 22 she decided to leave her hometown and pursue her modeling career so she moved to Miami and recorded her first record. Seeing how expensive studio time and travel was Ree discovered another talent, pole dancing. On her own, and in a city where she knew no one, Ree began dancing at the hottest strip clubs between dade and broward county making ends meet and supporting her dream.


After attending the urban modelingAwards in Atlanta in 2013 Quiana decided she was more than her body and her looks, so she released her first project entitled "Savage beauty", a compilation of covers from her favorite artists. The tape did exceptionally well, gaining notoriety from blogs such as HipHopDX HIPHOPSINCE87 HIPHOPONDECK and more.

Ree pushed her music through the djs at the strip clubs she entertained at throughout New Orleans, Jackson Mississippi, And Houston Tx. Living a double life dancing in New Orleans and taking the earnings back to Atlanta on that six hour drive was just Quiana Ree's way of life. She is truly a driven resilient talented young hustler.

After a few A3c and sxsw performances she had become a seasoned independent artist. Launching her first distribution label, SAVAGE BEAUTY MUSIC GROUP. Ree extended her talents even more submitting to casting agencies in Atlanta; landing on television shows like "T.I.'s The Grand Hustle" And BET'S "The Bobby Brown Story" as well as a feature in the Migo's "Pipe it up" video.

Even Though she traded her dance shoes in for a microphone Ree has never forgotten where she came from, the struggles that made her and the dancers she met along the way who inspire her music. The stoner chic Savage Beauty is making it her goal for women to take their power back and Own their sexuality. Her raw, unfiltered lyrics are just another reason why the game needs her, we need more Female mc's like Quiana Ree to tell her story.


